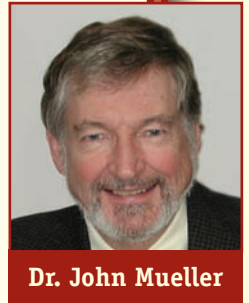

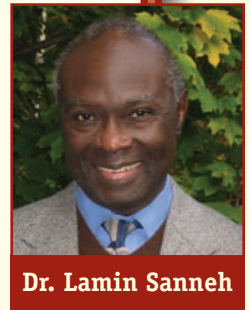

DR. LAMIN SANNEH, a naturalized U.S. citizen, is descended from the Nyanchos, an ancient African royal house, and was educated on four continents. He went to school with chiefs' sons in the Gambia, West Africa, received his M.A. from the University of Birmingham (England) and came to the United States on a United States government scholarship to study history. After graduating, he spent several years studying classical Arabic and Islam, including a stint in the Middle East and working with the churches in Africa and with international organizations concerned with inter-religious issues. He received his Ph.D. in Islamic history at the University of London.

He was a professor at Harvard University for eight years before moving to Yale University in 1989 as the D. Willis James Professor of Missions and World Christianity, with a concurrent courtesy appointment as Professor of History at Yale College. He has been actively involved in Yale's Council on African Studies and serves on the editorial board of several academic journals. He is an Honorary Research Professor at the School of Oriental and African Studies in the University of London and is a life member of Clare Hall, Cambridge University. He serves on the board of Ethics and Public Policy at Harvard University, was chairman of Yale's Council on African Studies and is a member of the Board of the Institute for Advanced Christian Studies, an editor-at-large of the ecumenical weekly "The Christian Century" and the Birmingham Civil Rights Institute in Birmingham, Ala.
