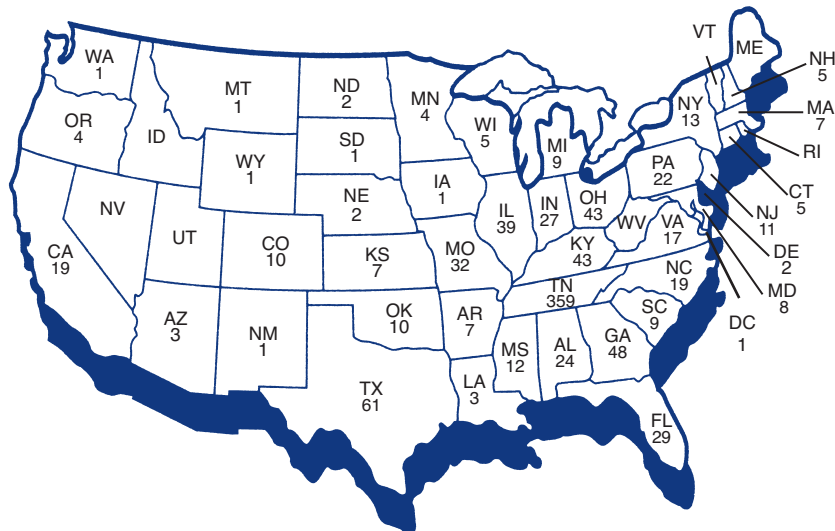
# Freshman Profile

## The Freshman Class of 2008

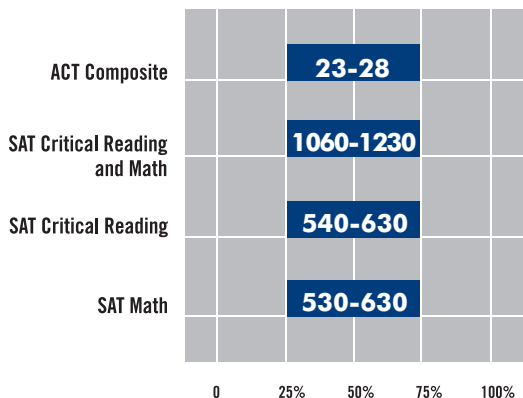

### Academic Credentials

The incoming class includes 31 valedictorians and 17 salutatorians. Their average unweighted GPA is 3.52. Thirty-six percent were in the top 10% of their graduating class. Seventy percent were in the top 25% of their graduating class.

## Scholarship Information

Belmont offers a variety of merit-based scholarships for freshmen. The application for admission to the university serves as the merit-based scholarship application. Priority consideration for scholarships is given to those applications postmarked by **December 1** of the senior year. To be considered competitive for an academic scholarship, a student must meet at least four of the six criteria listed below.

- 3.5 academic core GPA (unweighted)
- 3.5 cumulative GPA (unweighted)
- 28 ACT or higher or 1260 SAT (critical reading and math) or higher
- Top 10% of class rank
- Strong college preparatory curriculum
- Significant individual achievement

Five students will be chosen to receive the Presidential Scholarship, Belmont's top merit award. In addition to meeting all of the above criteria, applicants must have a 29 ACT or 1320 SAT (critical reading and math) or higher. More than 425 applicants qualified for the Presidential Scholarship in 2008.
